George Joseph Bartnett died peacefully in Mendon, NY at the age of 93 on March 12, 2020.

He served on the Underwater Demolition Team (which is now part of the Navy Seals) on the "USS Marlboro" and the "USS Wisconsin". The "USS Wisconsin" is now currently functioning as a museum ship in Norfolk, VA.

He was an individual who loved deer hunting and never missed an opening day until this past year. He loved the water, enjoyed fishing off the coast of Shelter Island, NY. He was an active and dedicated member of St. Helen's Roman Catholic Church in Chili, NY and served as an usher for many years. He was appointed to the town of Chili, NY as a Deputy Supervisor and served on the Traffic and Safety Committee after he retired. He served for over 20 years.
