### DAVID EDWARD ORTMAN

Passed away after a courageous fight with cancer on October 7, 2024.

David is survived by his wife, Susan Anderson. Survived also by his parents, Edward and Evelyn Ortman; sister, Christine Arcara (Derek Peacock); brothers-in-law, Paul, Todd, and Peter Anderson; niece, Lindsay (Aaron) Luna; nephew, Daniel (Olivia) Otto; aunt, Ruth Fraty; uncle, Donald Wainright; great-niece and nephews and cousins.

David was born in Rochester, New York, on June 15, 1954, and graduated from Gates-Chili High School and Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He worked as a Chemical Engineer for Dow Chemical in Midland, Michigan, for over 30 years. After Dow divested his business, Dave continued his same R&D role with Trinseo, LLC, first as an employee and later as a contractor. His work involved the development and support of R&D business software that was used globally. He spent extensive time over the years in Germany, Venezuela, South Korea, California, and Georgia.

At his high school reunion in 1992, Dave re-met Sue, an acquaintance since fourth grade. After a long-distance relationship between Washington, D.C. and Michigan, Sue moved to Midland, and they were married in 1994. Dave and Sue shared a love of travel, and they vacationed often with trips throughout the United States, Europe, Central and Latin America, and Africa. They moved back to Rochester in 2006, primarily to be closer to family; both were able to work virtually from their home.

Dave was an avid photographer. He loved daily walks with his dogs, first Scooby and then Cole. He was active in the MIT Club of Rochester and had volunteered with Literacy Volunteers and LifeSpan. He enjoyed dining out and going to the theater at GEVA. Dave was a political news junkie and worked as an election poll worker for Monroe County. He was the family and friends' go-to guy for all computer hardware and software issues.

His was a life well lived. He will be sorely missed by family and friends.
