Edgar Robert “Bob” Ray, 91, passed away peacefully on September 10, 2025. Born in Buffalo, New York, on March 13, 1934, he was the son of Edgar Phillips Ray and Loretta Florence (Okoniewski) Ray.

On April 6, 1957, Edgar married the love of his life, Patricia (Wisnet) Ray. Together they built a family rooted in faith, love, and tradition. He was a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather who believed deeply in the importance of faith and family.

Edgar is survived by his beloved wife Patricia, and their children: Patricia (Carl Dunn), Robert (Patricia), Thomas (Darlene), James (Lina), Jacqueline (Jim) Mondt, Michele (James) O’Rawe, and Michael (Jennifer). A proud parishioner of St. Bonaventure Church in West Seneca, NY, Edgar’s life was grounded in faith. He served his country in the U.S. Army from 1957–1959, receiving his honorable discharge in 1963. He worked for Conrail for 40 years before his retirement. Beyond work and service, Edgar found great joy

in the outdoors and respected the beauty of nature. He also gave of his time as a Scout Master for Pack 635 with the Boy Scouts of America, guiding young men with the same values he lived by.

Edgar will be remembered as a man of integrity, faith, and devotion, whose love for his family and appreciation of life's simple joys will continue to inspire all who knew him.

“ My Dad – he was my rock, my protector, my role model, my friend. His passing left a void that no one else will ever fill. It’s been six months since my Dad passed and I miss him every day.

Dad’s birthday is Friday, so as I remember him and reflect on his life, it’s important to me that I take this time to share who my Dad was to me.....

A loving husband and father. My Dad had a fierce love of and commitment to family. One of his greatest joys was spending time with Mom, us kids, his grandchildren, and our extended family. When once asked about his dream vacation destination, my Dad responded “Long Beach... because that’s where my family is all together”. My fondest memories are family times when I heard my Dad’s belly laugh and saw his happy tears as he joked with my brothers. Dad was a humble man who taught us to always cherish your family and your roots.

A man of integrity. My Dad’s honesty and strong moral compass was evident in everything he did. He always believed in doing the right thing and, as importantly, walking away from a bad situation. He taught us that if you were there, even if not participating, you were just as guilty. I learned from him that integrity is more than honesty. It is being true to yourself and your beliefs.

A source of strength and wisdom. My Dad was typically a man of few words and he was tough when it came to discipline. As kids, we always knew that we had crossed that line when Dad’s eyes bulged. But he was always there when we needed him. I didn’t appreciate the extent of my Dad’s love, resilience, and wisdom back then. As an adult, I have been constantly impressed with Dad’s understanding of the world, wealth of practical knowledge, and ability to share advice without judgement. I will especially treasure the quiet conversations we had later in life.

A lover of nature and animals. Whether he was camping, hiking, or

gardening, he was truly in his element when outdoors. It was his happy place. He would wonder what music the flowers listened to when they danced in the wind, saw countless shapes in the clouds, and was in awe of a good lightning storm. He loved all animals and his face would especially light up whenever he would cuddle one of our dogs. He taught me not only to love nature but to truly respect it.

A true sense of wonder and adventure. My Dad loved to “take the scenic route”. He was happiest when he could just roam and explore the countryside. Our family road trips were always an adventure! My Dad also loved to tinker. You never knew what he’d come up with as he happily brrruppted throughout his day! I fondly remember our canvas camping cupboard, our green spray-painted camping gear boxes with the rope handles, and especially the play kitchen he made for me from Rosinski furniture boxes when I was eight. My Dad taught me to appreciate the simple things in life and try to share that joy with others.

Dad was a big man with an even bigger heart. If the truest measure of a person is how much they loved and were loved in return – my Dad was a giant! Did he have flaws? Absolutely! Dad wasn’t perfect, but he was always perfectly himself.

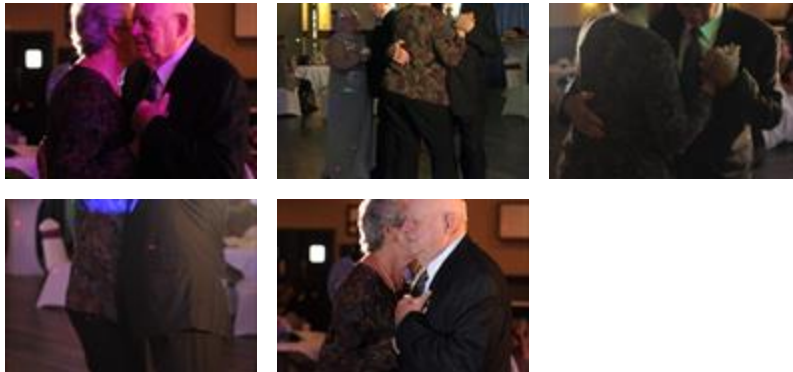

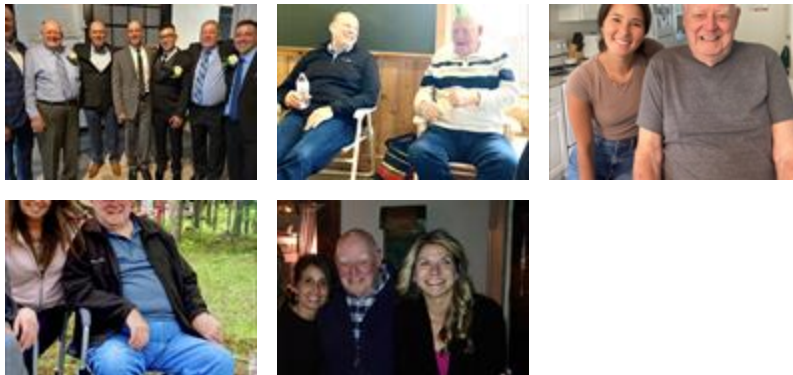
