I remember the music class when we sang "Oh, how lovely to dance the Jarabe." ♦ Elaine was one of the four students chosen to demonstrate the Mexican dance (I think the music teacher was being observed by administrators that day). And from fourth through seventh grade she and I were daily passengers on Gordon Miller's Bus #17.

*Jumping ahead to senior year, who can forget her performance as the lead in *My Sister Eileen*? After graduation, it was the summer of 1965 when she and I ran into each other on a street in downtown Rochester. As I recall she was working at RG&E and I was doing temp work at an architect's office.*

Fast forward nearly fifty years: we re-connected at reunion committee meetings in 2011, and the rest is history.
