She was also an avid reader until she lost her sight later in life and then turned to audiobooks. A Mets fan from the very beginning, she rarely missed a game and was able to attend a few in person. She also cheered faithfully for the Buffalo Bills. She was also known for making the best potato salad and strawberry-rhubarb pie. Until the age of 90, she enjoyed going to the YMCA for water aerobics, socializing, and monthly luncheons. She also loved taking senior bus trips. Helen had many lifelong friends and made new ones wherever she went. At the age of 95, she underwent an aortic valve replacement and inspired others at the hospital with her stamina and quick recovery.

Helen was predeceased by her husband, Richard; her son, Jeffrey; her grandson, Samuel; her siblings, Barbara Sullivan and Stephen Feeney; and her dear friend of 80 years, Bernardine Gordon.

She is survived by her daughters, Jennifer (Ralph) Alwardt, Nancy (Tom) Allen, and Terry (Bob) Schriever; her son, Jim (Amy) Taylor; 14 grandchildren; 22 great-grandchildren; and her sisters Mary and Sharon Feeney.
