I apologize in advance for this long message. Before I actually met Karen in person in the 80's, I knew who she was; like she was someone famous. People spoke about her; always in a positive way. My family of 5 kids (3 of us being girls) and the Stulpin's 3 handsome sons grew up together, intersecting lives on multiple levels. First, I knew Karen as "Don's girlfriend", then "Don's wife". Soon I knew that they opened Stulpin's Gym. When I really "met" Karen in person, she had come to Wegmans Office to offer a discount to Wegmans employees on gym memberships. We sat in a tiny interview room. It's so memorable to me. One-on-one, she was even more amazing than her public reputation. I took advantage of the gym membership discount and began attending her classes. When I saw how fit and disciplined Karen was, I was so impressed. I had never been in an environment like this before. Karen took what was typically "a man's" gym and transformed it into a family fitness destination. I was hooked for life. It was 1988, and I had just learned I was pregnant with Stephanie; so, I thought I couldn't exercise. Karen taught me otherwise. Brooke was Karen's little side-kick at about 3 years old; they went everywhere together. Karen was pregnant with Ally at the same time I was. Karen taught me how to stay fit during and after our pregnancies. After our daughters were born, I became the babysitter in the little room at Stulpin's Gym in exchange for my membership. Each day I would bring Ally back to my house for lunch and a nap. I loved those few years; getting to know "Uncle Bob" and Karen's Dad, "Pat". I met many gym members who I still cross paths with today. I was lucky to have Karen one-on-one while she picked up Ally at the end of each busy day. No longer was she "Don's wife"; she was definitely her own, independent woman. There were some personal experiences she shared with me that just kept my adoration and respect growing. In 1991, I moved out of town, but returned back to Spencerport a few years later. Karen and I had lost touch, but our families' relationships continued to overlap. Don, Dave and Dougie Stulpin became my dad's best friends (Dougie lived at my dad's house). My dad's house became a kind of "Divorced Men's Club". 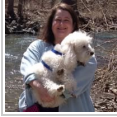
