“ I remember Mike mostly as a co-worker who was a friend. We would see each other generally at work, our conversation would usually pick up right where we left off the last time we saw each other. Mike was very familiar with the Wilsey family history with the sheriff's office (now spanning three generations).

When I decided to take a break from the road, the advice I got from many co-workers was, go to the airport, it's quiet. The assignment at the airport wasn't difficult to say the least, but you learned everything by "flying by the seat of your pants". The airport simply lacked any structure. When ever I brought this fact up, I got a lot of smiles and eye rolls, it's the airport! relax and enjoy! Everybody except Mike that is.

Mike encouraged me to develop an operations manual, that would assist deputies and sergeants, giving both direction and guidance in common, as well as rare situations. He offered his own ideas and advice, as well as constructive criticism, eventually an Operations Manual was developed and distributed to the members of the airport unit with little notice or fanfare. I remember asking Mike "you think it was worth the effort ? ".

On September 11, 2001, all that changed, in ironic twist of fate, many of the unusual circumstances were addressed in the "SOP Manual".

Sometime after 911 the MCSO received very positive compliments from the FAA (later to become the TSA) for our quick and professional response to the events of 911, citing the SOP manual as a valuable tool. It was after that meeting, Mike turned and asked "you think it was worth the effort ?"

That was an example of Mike's leadership....subtle and to the point. Mike and I would later work together in private security with the TSA. I would see Mike occasionally from time to time, picking up right where we left off.

Sadly I lost touch with Mike over the last few years, not until very recently did I hear how sick he was, I never got to have that last chat with him...I'll always miss that opportunity.

I'm not really religious, nor am I much of a believer...but somehow somewhere I imagine Mike and I will meet again....and as before,

*we'll pick the conversation up right where we left off the last time.
RIP Mike... from an old co-worker and friend.*
