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Wayne M. Drew, 71, of Chili, NY, died at Strong Memorial Hospital on Friday, September 12, 2025, after a hard-fought battle with cancer.

Born in Syracuse, NY, on November 29, 1953, he was the first of four children of the late Edward and Marion Lukaczyk Drew. He is survived by his beloved wife, Nancy De Leys Drew; daughter Amy Ekanayake (Dinesh & granddaughters Kayla and Honna); son David Drew (Lauren); daughter Alyssa Nicola (Timothy); siblings Judith Jones (Howard), David Drew (Kathleen), andCarolynne Martin, as well as several nieces and nephews. Wayne was known for his faith and trust in Jesus Christ, which formed the core of his being. He lived out what he believed. As an earthly father, he reflected the love of his Heavenly Father, not only to his family, but to everyone he encountered.
